shoreline he must have walked in His journey. He found John the Baptist in the river Jordan baptizing people who had confessed their sins and asked John to baptize him. Of course, John tried to talk Jesus out of it and stated, “You should be the one baptizing me”; but Jesus insisted. Jesus then journeyed to the Sea of Galilee, where he began preaching along the shore. It was there he found his first disciples, Simon Peter and Andrew, casting their nets into the sea in search of fish. Jesus called to them, “Come, follow me, and I will show you how to fish for people.” They drop everything, leave their boat on the shore and follow him. Further up the shore, Jesus finds James and John and also calls them to follow him, which they also do, leaving their father and their boat behind. He later finds Levi (Matthew) along the lakeshore collecting taxes. He calls to him and he leaves his profession to follow Jesus. It fascinates me that these men would leave everything they knew to follow a man they just met. How powerful His words must have been!

We’ve heard the story of Jesus walking on the water to the boat to save the disciples during a storm. I like the story where he appears to them after his death and resurrection on the shore, telling them how to fish from the right side of the boat and they bring 153 fish up in their nets after they have fished all night long and caught nothing. Do you know the significance of the 153 fish? At that time, there were 153 different species of fish in the world and the disciples caught one of every species. Talk about a powerful visual! Jesus had told the disciples he would make them fishers of men and that net full of fish represented every person on earth! Whether you’re a person who likes the water or the land, young or old, housebound or a mountain climber, shepherd or tax collector, sinner or saint; Jesus is walking along the shoreline waiting for you. He wants you in His net. He loves you just as you are. He has fished for you for a long time. He is patient. He will wait. The only thing you have to do is ask Him into your heart and then he will haul you into His net of love, grace and mercy. That is surely the best place you can ever be.

The Purpose of Emmaus

To friends of the Southern Ohio Emmaus Community:

I have been reflecting a lot on something we say often in the Southern Ohio Emmaus Community. I have heard it said often: "Emmaus is all about the pilgrims." It is true that during the weekend experience on our walks that the focus is often on the pilgrims. But I would wish for us that we take a deeper and longer perspective on the Purpose of Emmaus.

The Purpose of Emmaus is to develop Christian leaders.

How do we develop leaders who have the heart of Jesus, who was the ultimate leader?

- 1) To be willing to submit to whatever role that the Lord has staked out for us. The arena that we call "Emmaus" is a great tool in that regard. What did Jesus say? "I do nothing but what the Heavenly Father wants me to do." We should have the same attitude of submission that Jesus did. There are many roles in the Emmaus Community that give us opportunity to learn submission. Service on the Logistics and Agape Teams, for instance, give us an opportunity to submit to the leaders of those teams on particular weekends, as well as submission to one another. Service in the Conference Room give us an opportunity to submit to the Lay Director and the Arrears Table. A good Christian leader develops an attitude of submission - to the Emmaus leaders, to the leaders in their church, etc.
- 2) To develop a "sense" of God's nudges/leadings in our lives. Emmaus is a great tool to "get out of our comfort zone" to learn how to fully rely on God. The purpose of the "chairs" of service is to learn this great Principle of Reliance. As a Logistics and Agape Person, you learn how to "sense" where God needs you; in the Conference Room, there should be a growth in one's prayer life, as you realize that you are in a position to influence someone's life for eternity and for future Christian service - "Lord, I can't do this myself - I need your guidance."
- 3) To develop a sense of humility. A good Christian leader learns humility. It is not "all about them" - it is about being a part of a team. Jesus learned humility through his time on earth, eventually, even, to death on the Cross. Emmaus is an arena where we break that attitude: "It's about all me and what I want" to the attitude - "How can I be a part - however small or big - to be a part of the Kingdom of God, which will last forever.

Although we minister to pilgrims on our walk weekends, let us always remember that it is not "all about the pilgrims." It is all about learning how to be more submissive, more open to the leading of the Spirit, and more humble. In this way, we become more like Jesus. Decolores!

Time to Update

We are on Walks 60 which means the Southern Ohio Emmaus Community has been the hands and feet of Jesus for 30 years. 30 years ago, you likely did not have fuel injection in your car, did not have a personal computer (or one with only 64k of memory), and definitely no cell phone. I am not sure these technological advances are necessarily benefits, but they are here for the foreseeable future. Our By Laws are that old, too, and have not been updated.

Attached to this Newsletter is a proposed set of By Laws. You might note the color differences. The blue is just a change of language (sometimes just spelling or grammar) without adding anything new. The red is for new language/provisions. The changes/additions cover five areas: 1) Clarification of current practices and interpretations based on the original By Laws; 2) Provisions for electronic means of communication; 3) Defining an Executive Committee for policy formation; 4) Ability to up-date with technological changes; and 5) Refining and Defining certain processes (i.e. Amendments, Election of Board).

Please review the proposed changes/additions. The Board has provided a 60 day comment period after the issuance of the April Newsletter. You can send your comments to any member of the Board. Then, after the Board approves reviews the comments and makes any changes or modifications, a final proposed set of By Laws will be issued for ratification until Labor Day in September. There will be a ballot in the July Newsletter and at the gatherings. If ratified by a majority of the votes, then the new By Laws will be effective October 1, 2016.

Thank you for your attention. Especially, thank you for being Jesus' hands and feet in what is called the Emmaus Walk.
