Enough!

Just like all of you at the closing ceremony of my walk, I was asked what did I learn and what was I going to do about it. I answered at that time that I always knew God loved me but that I didn't realize how much and that I was enough. I also had a tendency to volunteer before waiting for God's discernment. I was going to pray and wait for discernment. As those of you mature Christians may not be surprised many of the things I volunteered for before my walk soon became hard to continue to due to schedule conflicts and/or skills to complete the task were not in my skill set. As a result I began to believe I would never be enough to serve God. During my walk I learned that I could be enough but if I wasn't and I was in God's will he would make me enough or provide help.

As we know God is faithful. Shortly after my walk I felt God's pull to work with kids in Junior Garden Club. I prayed and felt God wanted me to keep the Junior Club independent of the adult club but countywide so that all 5 adult garden clubs could be part of the Juniors. I decided to meet at the library so that the club would be open to all kids in the county. Structure the activities but not the membership of the kids (essentially drop in members). I asked my sister Peggy to assist me.

I set up the first meeting, when I showed up at the first meeting one of the librarians asked if I had limited the number of participants? No, I replied. You could have a hundred kids was her response. I swallowed and said God you remember you said I could be enough or you would send help? I am counting on you. Stepping out in faith I walked to the meeting room. Not one hundred but forty. That was three years ago and this group continues, sometimes we have 25 kids and sometimes 4. Always God is faithful by myself I am not enough but my stepping out in faith is enough for God to work with these kids because other hands are always available to help.



This past Meigs county fair I marvel at what God has accomplished. Sixteen kids ranging in age from 6 to 13 many I would have never met have forged friendships and team working skills. They constructed 40 arrangements in two flower shows and 130 horticulture samples. With the causal membership of this group, individuals who show up are immediately absorbed into the group helping each other and sharing resources. Fathers and Mothers helping not only their kids but others. Peggy and I provide knowledge and support but as knowledge is acquired individuals share. Times during which arrangement and horticulture samples are being prepared are chaotic but cheerful. We are very tired at the end, it is the holy spirit that uplifts us and allows the group to do wonderful things.

The displays are part of two Flower shows that include adult arrangements. The arrangements are judged. I made it clear to the kids that while the judge looks at each arrangement with criteria, creativity can cause different judges to choose different arrangement so it is most important that they like their arrangement. The kids cheer and congratulate the winner while telling each other what they like about the arrangements that didn't win. I am very lucky to a apart of such a great group. Frequently I am told this is wonderful and how do others replicate this group. My reply It's not me It's God. I could not do this under my own energy without the help of my sister Peggy, parents, adult garden club members and kids. The Holy Spirit is always there making sure there is ENOUGH: help, love, sharing, energy and yes materials. So am I enough to serve God? I can be if I listen, pray and obey, God is faithful to provide all that is need.
