Why We Gather

While sorting through some really old Emmaus materials, I found this and it really reminded me how important Gatherings are to our Fourth Days. Here are the objectives of an Emmaus Community Gathering:

- To make visible the Christian community—persons of various churches and denominations who, “in an attitude of progressive conversion, are **united** in one faith, one Lord, and one baptism.
- To encourage one another to continue our walk with the Lord and to **persevere** in grace through the practice of **piety, study and action**, through membership in a **group reunion**, and through active participation in one’s own church.
- To **inspire** one another to make profound changes in our own lives and in the environments in which we live.
- To maintain relationships with other Emmaus Pilgrims in order to build a vital community of persons to **support future Emmaus Walk Weekends**.
- To educate the Emmaus Community in the Walk to Emmaus movement, weekends, and a method for living in the **Fourth Day**.

“They got up and returned at once to Jerusalem. There they found the Eleven and those with them, assembled together and saying ‘It is true! The Lord has risen and has appeared to Simon.’ Then the two told what had happened on the way, and how Jesus was recognized by them when he broke the bread.”

The heart of the Gathering is seen in **Luke 24:33-35 (NIV)** This was after Cleopas and other disciple’s eyes were opened and they recognizing Jesus as the stranger in their midst.

Following our Walk to Emmaus, we are encouraged to see every day as a continuing Walk to Emmaus in the **companionship** of the risen Christ. Just as the eleven gathered together, the monthly Gathering is for us a time to share our resurrection stories: how God became real to us on the road with a friend or through a stranger, through scripture, in the breaking of the bread, in the **sharing of our love**. Through singing and prayer, small groups, Fourth Day talks and Holy Communion, we share our stories and help one another recognize the risen Christ in the midst of our lives, that we may live more fully in the Presence.

Fee Increase for Fall Walks

The Southern Ohio Emmaus Board would like to thank all those faithful community members for their support. Thanks to your giving we have been able to avoid raising our pilgrim fee for five years. In 2012, your financial gifts (including collections at gatherings, candlelight and other special gifts) totaled over \$5000 and we would not have met our expenses without these gifts. Last year, 126 new pilgrims experienced the Walk to Emmaus and this could not have happened without your support.

The SOE board members have discussed ways to keep from raising fees, but reluctantly we have decided to raise the pilgrim fee from \$125 to \$150 beginning with the 2013 fall walks. The board wants you to understand what items contribute to the cost of an Emmaus Walk. As you can see, the new pilgrim fee (\$150) still doesn't cover the full cost of sponsoring a pilgrim (\$166). In fact, in addition to the costs for each pilgrim we also have supplies which need purchased for the walks and throughout the year. So when you see us taking up a collection, please consider helping so we can avoid further increases.

Sponsorship Tip

Throughout this year I hope to be able to offer some tips that may answer some questions you have or that could come up when sponsoring a pilgrim. One of the biggest problems facing our country and the geographic area that the Southern Ohio Emmaus Community serves is financial instability. This is becoming an ever greater concern even in our churches today. Due to the ever increasing costs of all aspects of the weekend "Walk to Emmaus" the board is announcing in this issue of "The Rainbow Connection" that they are raising the fee to attend a walk from \$125 to \$150. Please keep in mind this still does not cover the full cost for a pilgrim to attend the walk, and the community still needs your help as you have always helped. The board hopes that this fee increase does not cause someone to think more about the cost than what can be gained if someone attends the walk. I would pray that not one person doesn't attend because of the cost.

As sponsors we need to step up, not by paying the fee in its entirety or even part, although if you're able I know you will be blessed for your generosity, but by helping the pilgrim find the funds. Many times a church will help, share/reunion groups will help, other Emmaus members in your or the pilgrim's congregation may help and there are scholarships available just by asking ANY member of Board of Directors. Please if you know someone who needs help and you feel you've exhausted all sources; contact the board so we can help you with finding the fees required.

Through our prayers, generosity and God's unending love we can sponsor more pilgrims, which spreads His love and grace to more people to just continue to lead the Church out and to sow as we have been called to sow. God Bless and Decolores!
